

Dear Friends,

The month of April is an open door to spring. April can, of course, be very mixed with hail and even snow whilst at other times we may bask in warm sunshine, and often we can experience all four seasons in one day! Day by day the polyphony of morning birdsong increases and we cannot but notice the garden waking up with fresh buds and plants. April therefore speaks of new life and new beginnings.

This description of lovely, leafy Hampshire sounds rather twee in comparison to the horrifying images of the conflict in Ukraine that have filled our TV screens of late. Yet, images of desperate innocent people, families and children fleeing the war have galvanised the strong rejection of unwarranted violence in Europe, across the EU, the UK and more locally, our villages. I have heard stories of large amounts of clothing and goods sent to refugees, clear evidence that a common humanity does exist, and people practically demonstrate that they do care deeply about others they do not know from another country and culture caught up in the evils of war.

Life, new beginnings and hope, is central to the Easter story. Christian hope is not rooted in a distant or romantic past, remembering a one off event two thousand years ago. Easter faith is prophetically grounded in the here and now, in light overcoming darkness. The death and resurrection of Jesus spans across time and space and speaks to us today. There are many destructive forces at play in our world that speak fear and pain into our broken humanity. Into all these situations Christ's 'Passion' points to transformed and transfigured life, Easter life. Jesus was no stranger to suffering and humiliation, and if we look hard enough, we will see he is there walking with us in our own troubles. With the dawning of Easter day we are offered a new life with God and God calls us to share his peace with the world.

We continue to hold the people of Ukraine and indeed other places of conflict across our world in prayer as we strive for peace.



Message from Mityana



As I write, the last of the house martins are whirling around here in Mityana before they leave for northern Europe. It is amazing to see them. People in the rural communities often remark that they don't know where they go, just that they come back at the end of each year.

The two years away have not marred our relationships at all but as you would expect, the children we know well have all grown taller and they tell me my hair is whiter! They have been so surprised that we have returned. They are so grateful.

What is noticeable is, the prices of everything from fruit and veg to cement have risen substantially. The schools too, are full to overflowing. Mityana Junior has over 700 students. P3 (our Year 2) has over 100 children squashed into a classroom built for a maximum of 45. How on earth do you teach that many students? Wilberforce, the head teacher, whom some of you may remember, has had to employ four more teachers, asking for parental contributions.

We went to the College where they are training the lay readers (we have sponsored ten of them this year) and the welcome was so moving. They learn practical skills alongside bible study and they grow all their own food. The three water dams are each serving over 1,500 people and with the dry season coming to an end they still have so much water in them. This has been one of the most wonderful things to see. Plenty of water at the end of the dry season is quite amazing.



The ladies pictured came to visit us at the most wonderfully inspiring school, where teachers have applied themselves in very difficult circumstances at a place called Mugungulu. The children are in very small wooden shed classrooms. The joy on their faces, the excitement of our visit.



This has been a humbling trip as we have witnessed such generosity from those who have so little alongside a welcome second to none. As I finish this it comes with very best wishes for Easter.



The Greening Campaign gives advice and support to communities so that they can take meaningful action to reduce their environmental impact.

Phase 1 of the Greening Campaign is all about inspiring the community to be active in the fight against climate change. By now, we will have had the inaugural Greening Longparish Meeting. The meeting agenda included an introduction to the Greening Campaign; a presentation by Elysia Blocksidge, focusing on what Climate Change means to her and her generation; and a group exercise to decide on some simple pledges for Longparish to reduce our environmental impact.

The next step is to launch our Pledge Card in April/May. Please look out for a card with the Greening Longparish logo dropping though your door. Please choose five of the simple pledges you feel you can commit to, and then display the card in your front window. Later in May we will count the cards and send them off for a calculation by the Energy Saving Trust. This will show the CO₂ our community can save through our actions, as well as the money saved too.

Phase 2 of the Greening Campaign focuses on three pillars: nature, retrofit and health and wellbeing. This phase is supported by Hampshire County Council, meaning we will receive specialist advice on these areas. The Sustainability Centre will provide information about retrofitting homes to reduce energy use. Hampshire and Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust will help us to understand how we can best support local wildlife and biodiversity. There will also be specialist support to help us consider and plan for the likely health impacts of Climate Change. We hope to begin this phase in the summer.

Longparish Church of England Primary School

March brought Science Week to Longparish School - children could come into school dressed as a scientist or in the theme 'growth'. It was truly delightful to see Marie Curie, Florence Nightingale, Jane Goodall, Albert Einstein, Galileo, David Attenborough, Charles Darwin and many more people from the world of science, technology, engineering and mathematics walk through the school gate. The children enthusiastically talked about individual costumes, who or what had inspired them with some really interesting factual information being shared.

All children were in their house teams taking part in four different science investigations Stretchy Slime Experiment, Wonderful Working Worms, Tree Trouble and Outdoor Gym, with each class teacher. It was a fantastic opportunity to be collaborative, do some outside learning and to just be curious!



We were lucky enough to have parent visitors in school: Dr. Doughty-Jones, who is a geologist working for an oil and gas company, and Mr Doughty-Jones an engineer working for a nuclear waste

company organised and ran an activity for each class. The children were able to handle some rock samples as they learnt about different types of rocks and the formation/growth of different rock types by making their own chocolate rocks which they were then able to taste, much to their delight! The older children were challenged to design and create a strong structure which could be used for offshore energy production (oil rigs) and generation (wind turbines), using only straws and marshmallows. This provoked some very interesting debate and strong opinions about how the structure should be!

term holiday we did a sponsored read and the children looked at 152 books with their families. Well done to everyone who took part. We then had lots of children come dressed as their favourite story book characters for World Book Day.



In Forest School we have been seeing some signs that spring is here with snowdrops and daffodils in flower and the catkins on the willow tree. We had some frogspawn that has already turned into tadpoles - the children have liked watching it change and can't wait until we get little froglets. We have a brand new birdbox with a camera that we have just installed. We are hoping that we will have some birds nest in it and we can see how the eggs hatch and the chicks grow. Hopefully we will have some updates on that for you all in the next edition.

We were very excited when we had a visit from the fire fighters from Andover fire station. The children got to sit in the fire engine and use the hose.



LONGPARISH WILDLIFE By Chris Bowman

THE MEDITERRANEAN GULL

I have a new find for the village: a Mediterranean gull. Very similar to our Black-headed gull, which has a brown head, the Med gulls have a deep black head and in the breeding season, thin white line around the eyes, red beak and legs.



They first bred in England in 1968 and since 1979 they have bred every year. They breed alongside the Black-headed gulls on an island, in lakes or on flood plains and grasslands always close to water.

Nesting starts in mid-May on the ground in the open or low vegetation. A shallow depression is made lined with grass and feathers. 2-3 eggs are laid: pale cream, yellow, or buff, speckled, spotted and scrawled with black or dark brown, incubated for 23-25 days and fledge in 35-40 days. Their food is fish, worms, scraps and insects, often found with other gulls on rubbish tips.

Spring is nearly here the birds are starting to sing, I saw my first Blackbird carrying nesting material on the 15th of March. Keep your eyes open for Swallows, which usually start arriving the second week of April.

Reginald Josiah Wedgwood Temple 18th October 1930 - 14 December 2021



Not many people have two well attended, moving funeral services, Reg did. There was a Celebration of Life Service in Rockingham, Western Australia for his family and Australian friends on 29th December 2021. However, it was Reg's wish that he be buried in Longparish Cemetery, so he was flown to England for a Burial Service in St Nicholas Church on 4th February 2022. His internment in the

Cemetery was to the beautiful sound of the Longparish Church bells ringing a quarter peal in his honour, as an old Longparish bell ringer of many years ago.

Reg was born in Portsmouth, the fifth of six children. He was evacuated to Longparish in May 1940, where he lived with George and Winifred Howell. George Howell was the water keeper on the Middleton Estate. Reg loved Longparish, its river and countryside, the village, Church and Longparish school, where he was a pupil. He had a magic childhood on the riverbanks and fields which gave him a lifelong love of nature, sport, gardening and DIY. As a boy he blew the Church organ, then became a bell ringer, even ringing for his own wedding! He played soccer for Longparish and Wherwell and was Captain of the B team of Longparish Cricket Club in the sixties. At the age of 18, Reg trained as an electrician in the Royal Navy, serving in the Far East in the Malayan Emergency and the Korean War.

On 2nd April 1956 he married Mary Josephine Richardson, also of Longparish, in St Nicholas Church. Their first home was in Bransbury in the only cottage that almost survived the recent fire. In the 1960's they built a bungalow in Longparish called 'Concord', now known as 'Beechlands'. He worked as an electrician at Barton Stacey Camp and then at Portals. But the countryside was always calling, and Reg became a gamekeeper, first in Northington, then back in Longparish living at Elm Cottage and next in Somerset.

In 1974 they emigrated to Perth, Western Australia on RHMS Ellinis, probably among the last of the ten pound Poms. Once settled, Reg worked for the West Australian State Government first as an electrician and latterly as a fleet manager. He coached junior soccer teams, was cricket umpire for a senior league, played soccer on the same team as his sons and in the latter years, lawn bowls where he entered the Australian Championships.

Retirement saw them travelling the world; the family called it their eternal summer, often to England and Longparish. Above all Reg was a family man; family were first and foremost. Reg passed away aged 91 and is survived by his wife, Mary, his four children, Graham, Rosemary, George and Allison, two daughters in law, Lyn and Jean, eight grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren. All in Australia.

We're proud and excited to report that our retiring Chair of Whitchurch Silk Mill Trust was presented with an MBE by HRH The Prince of Wales at a recent investiture at Windsor Castle. Christine was awarded this honour for services to cultural heritage in Hampshire. In the last 20 years she has worked tirelessly with the county's museums to help them raise standards of conservation, presentation, management and governance. Participants enjoy the company of like-minded people learning new skills or honing existing ones. Past sessions have included silk painting, embroidery and silk bead-wrapping. 





The Parish Council helps to make decisions that affect all of us, so now's the time to become part of this decision making body. Drainage, roads, flood prevention, tree and wildlife conservation, planning, playing fields, amenities and more, are all part of the Parish Council remit. Your dynamism, fresh thinking, expertise and local experience would be welcome. You'll find the Electoral Commission information and application form on the Basingstoke & Deane Borough Council website

Nominations may be submitted between 10am and 4pm on any weekday from Friday 25th March until Tuesday 5th April 2022, inclusive.

If the Returning Officer receives more nominations than the number of vacant seats, there will be an **election on Thursday 5th May**. If there are fewer nominations than the number of vacancies, all validly nominated candidates will be elected and the new parish council will then be able to co-opt to any remaining vacancies.

Tests had been carried out about access for large & small waste trucks and an engineer would measure the gradient. Other matters Clir Carr reported on included B&DBC's new budget, update on the Local Plan & its possible impact on StMB, and forthcoming B&DBC meetings to develop policies for climate emergencies.

- currently investigating grants and funding

Light Touch

The Sea of Soft Plastic

Soft plastics are not taken by the council,

but supermarkets are really getting up to speed with this. Whitchurch CO-OP, Andover Sainsburys and the large Tesco accept a large range of CLEAN plastics now. The others are still trialling their contribution to this effort. Recycling turns soft plastics in to coloured beads which are sent off to various manufacturers to make playground equipment, benches and walkways in nature reserves etc.

What exactly are soft plastics? The most recent quidance is, if you can easily screw it up and it can regain its shape it's fine. So yes, to things such as bubble wrap, dry cleaning bags, bread and frozen food bags, cereal liners, peelable food lids such as on yoghurt pots, shrink wrap, joiners from multipacks, cling film, all baby or pet food pouches, biscuit and sweet wrappers, crisp packets (metallic looking plastic is now okay), magazine wrappers, clean frozen food bags and crackly plastic such as flower or greeting card wrappers. But NO to biodegradable or compostable bags, any dirty bags, blister packs, foam or polystyrene. Sadly, rigid plastics such as food trays and pots are still not widely recycled, but there will be plenty of suggestions next month for these.



Of course, ideally don't buy plastic, especially not one-use plastic. The recycling system just cannot keep up and we will eventually run out of places for plastic benches etc. Every piece of plastic that has ever been manufactured and ended up in our environment is still on this planet and will remain there for ever in some form. This is because plastic degrades rather than decomposes.

How to avoid the stuff? Take your own containers to *Love and Joy* at Weyhill Fare to be refilled from her huge choice of store cupboard food and cleaning products. Soon our village shop will have our very own local version as well. Buy a few strong reusable light weight vegetable bags to manage your loose fruit and veg in supermarkets, or take your own bags to *Kenyons*, Andover market or our village shop.

Buy milk in returnable glass bottles from a dairy and get a soda syphon to make your own fizzy drinks with natural flavouring. Lastly, train yourself to carry a keep cup for hot drinks and a metal water bottle when out and about to replace the mountains of plastic bottles and plastic lined cups thrown away each year. *CH*



Discover our chalk streams with free events this month

Throughout their long history, our chalk streams have attracted people with their beauty and bounty. As settlements sprang up along their banks, many of them came under the care of private owners. Today, these winding waters connect thousands of gardens, estates, farms, and businesses.

As a result of this, some stretches of stream are closed to the public for safety or privacy reasons. Others are hidden in a different way: accessible, but not widely appreciated or understood. The Open Chalk Streams project aims to change that, by creating new ways to experience these places.

On special days each year, you can visit spaces that are normally off-limits and see familiar spots in a new light. You might get tips from a keen gardener, see restoration efforts, or wander in search of wildlife. We're pleased to offer a series of events this April, including two in the Bourne Valley:

St Mary Bourne Lake Thursday 7th April, 10am-12 Noon / 1- 3pm

A guided walk along a normally private stretch of river by St Mary Bourne Lake. See the improvements we've made to the stream habitats and hear all about the resident wildlife. After your visit, you can also walk the outside perimeter and use a guide to admire the many ornamental trees, some of which are memorial trees.

Gangbridge Lane (St Mary Bourne) Wednesday 13th April, 10am-12pm / 1.30-3.30pm

A guided walk around a lovely country garden. See a great example of an intermittent chalk stream (or 'winterbourne'), possibly in its natural dry phase, and find out what this dramatic transformation means for wildlife. Hear about winterbourne habitats, chalk stream plant life, and what species our wildlife surveys have uncovered.

Go Star Gazing in April

1st April - New Moon. Moon will be located on same side of the Earth as Sun and will not be visible in night sky. Best time to observe faint objects - galaxies and star clusters as no moonlight to interfere.



14 April - Full Moon. Moon will be located on opposite side of the Earth as the Sun and its face will be fully illuminated. This full moon known by early Native American Tribes as Pink Moon, as it marks appearance of wild ground Phlox. One of the first spring flowers.

22-23 April - Lyrids Meteor Shower. Lyrids average shower. Producing about 20 meteors per hour. Shower runs annually from April 16-25. Meteors sometimes produce bright dust trails that last several seconds. Waning gibbous Moon may block fainter meteors but still potential for good show. Best viewing dark locations after midnight. Meteors radiate from Constellation of Lyra but can appear anywhere in sky.

29 April - Mercury at Greatest Eastern

Elongation. Best time to view **Mercury** as it will be at its highest point above the horizon in evening sky. Look for Planet low in western sky after sunset.

30 April - New Moon. Moon located on same side of Earth as Sun & will not be visible in night sky. Best time of month to view faint galaxies & star clusters as no moon to interfere.

30 April - Partial Solar Eclipse. A partial eclipse occurs when Moon covers only part of the Sun. Sometimes resembling a bite out of a cookie. A partial eclipse can only be safely viewed with special solar filters or looking at the Sun's reflection. Partial eclipse visible throughout most of south-eastern Pacific Ocean & southern South America. Best observing in Argentina.

Hopefully you enjoyed participating in the star count. CPRE results will be reported in next month's edition. It will be interesting to see how the dark night sky in our AONB is impacted by light pollution.
