

Dear Friends,

Two major things happened for me in 2006. It was a big year. Coming up to twenty years ago.

Firstly, I decided to do a pilgrimage on my bike and chose the Camino Primitivo which begins in Santander and finishes in Santiago de Compostela. But I joined it in Oviedo, with a little over two hundred miles in ten days. I have to confess, I slightly miscalculated the days because I forgot that day one and day ten were to fly out and back, and day 9 I wanted to spend in Santiago. So that brought the number of days to seven! But I made it, on my own, with almost non-existent Spanish.

Tolkien says this in 'The Lord of the Rings'

'The road goes ever on and on, down from the door where it began,

now far ahead the road has gone on \sim and I must follow if I can'.

The Camino de Santiago is in fact a network of routes, many of Roman origin extending through Europe that have been used by pilgrims since 11th century to reach Santiago de Compostela. The Camino Primitivo, as its name suggests, is one of the earliest routes crossing northern Spain, over the Cantabrian Mountains and down to Santiago. This is a place of significance for Christians as we are told it is the resting place of St James, or so the legends suggest.

Then, as now, pilgrims stayed in refugios run by volunteers based on the medieval model of charity allowing pilgrims shelter that is available & affordable. I found these impossible to stay in if I needed any sleep. With up to twenty in a room the snoring was unbearable. I met a Dutch couple after one very difficult day and the wife said: *Wo more refugios for you. Two-star hotels it must be, if you will finish your pilgrimage.'* My body knew tiredness that it had never known before.

Often the routes are marked with a scallop shell and pilgrims also carry one of these and a credential - a document stamped along the way. I still have the same scallop shell on the back of my bike. The real mark of a pilgrim. The credential was put in a safe place when I got home, I haven't seen it since!

A pilgrimage may begin with a decision to make the journey but it rarely ends with the arrival in the city. When someone decides to make a pilgrimage, what they are really deciding to do is to begin a journey - opening themselves to a path of transformation, even if they don't know it. And because of everyone's different pace, how far they want to go each day, their fitness & commitments, the composition of the Camino is somehow fluid, each pilgrim making his/her own journey – physical and spiritual, that is uncontained, unstructured and personal.

And what you find is that transformation comes through interpreting the struggles or suffering, and what I mean by that is: taking the struggles and suffering as you continue, (for the walker very often the feet, for the cyclist \sim I'll let you guess!) but for all \sim interpreting the energy, determination and the unexpected in relation to where you are, how you are, and for Christians what the

stories of Jesus really mean to you. It seems the Camino is a metaphor for life, and the help offered on the way and solidarity of pilgrims are a model for community. The outward activity of walking or cycling parallels the inward activity of growth and maturity, in the hope that new understandings about self, the world and God will be gleaned along the way.

The Camino provides the space and time to reflect. Time away from the usual routine. I look back with huge affection. My time on the Camino was wonderful, but it wasn't easy. Some of the roads were utterly exhausting. Local people would help if you needed it but they wouldn't interfere and a) make it easier for you or b) solve your problems – these were for you, alone.

Santiago has a huge medieval cathedral – each day at 12 noon there is a Pilgrims' Service. It is just too big in my heart to articulate, but it is very moving and something I will never forget.

And the second major event in 2006 was Joseph. He had eleven brothers – that was a challenge – finding eleven men brave enough to sing. This was not about being alone, it was about community. And etched in my memory are scenes like Joseph being thrown into a wheelie bin and taken off to Egypt, Potiphar's wife throwing a wobbly when Jo said no, Pharaoh desperate for an answer to his dreams and Joseph's answer which went something like this:

Noble king, there is no doubt, what your dreams are all about

All these things you saw in your pyjamas are a long-range forecast for your farmers

And of course, so much more. Wonderful, blond curly haired Benjamin, the musicians, narrator, people in the kitchen & behind stage, singers, dancers and the list goes on. All sorts of people were involved: The kids were in Yr 5 & 6 – aged 10 and 11 and now twenty years on they are – well, I'll let you do the maths!

Community involvement and Individual experience. It sounds like church to me. We come together, to be together, but we also come to experience God individually, to learn and go out and share what we have been given with others.

Have a HAPPY EASTER everyone. Come and join us on Easter morning – a great celebration in church.



Longparish Wildlife

This winter has been a bit of a let down where the birds are concerned. Out of all the migrants that come to the village for winter the only one I have seen are Redwings. I have seen no Fieldfares, Siskins, Bramblings, or Redpolls. Experts are saying as winters are getting warmer the birds are staying at home instead of migrating hundreds of miles. It makes sense if your'e a small bird, why risk flying across the North Sea when you can stay at home. Sadly, our summer visitors are also in decline. In Cyprus, it is estimated that 620,000 migrant birds were killed last Autumn, and the goverment does not seem interested in doing much about it. Locals are using mist nets to capture some birds. Mist nets are fine netting put out in a long line, they play bird calls to attract them into the nets. The other way they are being captured is by putting glue on branches and when the bird lands on it, it becomes stuck. What do they do with all those birds? Blackcaps, Warblers etc are a delicacy in Cyprus.

Another reason for decline, is something I have told you about before. A disease called Trichomonas, or more commonly named Canker, is a parasite which affects the mouth and throat of birds. The birds have

difficulty eating as they cannot swallow, so as they try to eat they are forced spit the food out.

Then along comes another bird and eats it so that bird is infected too. This horrible disease eventually kills them. It is responsible for killing a lot of the Greenfinches and Chaffinches, and it has also spread to House Sparrows, Dunnocks and Great Tits.



In an effort to stop the spread of this horrid disease, the RSPB has now stopped selling flat seed trays.

But it's not all doom and gloom the Greenfinches seem to be on the up.

Longparish Little School

This month began as a time for celebrations at Little School, as we cherish the important days for the

families in our community. Our first celebration was for St David's Day, where we delighted in making scrumptious Welsh cakes. We also placed a bouquet of daffodils at the centre of our easel, inspiring the children to create beautiful paintings of them. Following this, we celebrated the Rio Carnival. For our snack, we baked a delicious Brazilian carrot cake that was a firm favourite. Additionally, we crafted

colourful carnival masks and passed through a glittery curtain that transported us to Rio, where we danced the Samba with our homemade shakers and enjoyed watching highlights of last year's carnival on the big screen. During Forest School, we celebrated Pancake Day by preparing

pancake Day by preparing pancake mix to cook over our campfire.

We also had the thrill of observing new wildlife, as we had frogspawn that we've watched transform into tiny tadpoles. Last week was particularly exciting with the arrival of duck eggs in the incubator. This activity, in collaboration with the Robin class, provides the children with the opportunity to learn about the life cycle of ducks. The excitement peaked

when the first duckling hatched, followed by its siblings the next day. The children were incredibly gentle and caring as they held the ducklings for the first time, enjoying watching them take their first little swim.



Throughout this month, we have not only assumed the role of livestock farmers, caring for our ducklings and tadpoles, but we have also ventured into arable farming. One of the children kindly brought in some wheat seeds from his grandfather's farm, and our wheat crop has already begun to germinate. We have been diligent in ensuring it is well-watered during this dry spell. Additionally, we noted on our calendar that it took 14 days for the green shoots to appear. We have also started to explore how litter affects our planet and wildlife as part of our Eco School curriculum. The children have engaged in litter picking to help keep our local environment tidy and welcomed village resident Christine Dryden, who



regularly conducts litter picks. She shared the rubbish she had collected and explained how it can harm local birds and animals. To further illustrate this issue, we

created a small world beach scene and added some plastic pollution, allowing the children to observe how sea creatures can become trapped or even ingest the plastic that is carelessly discarded.

Major-General Dawnay let them rebuild it above the Cleeves, overlooking the river.

Parish Council Activities

The Parish Council held its monthly meeting on Tuesday March 11th at which

local councillor Sam Carr reported on the current state of planning for the

major reorganisation of local government that the Government is introducing, and will see the end of the structures that have been in place for the past fifty years with new bodies to replace them. This will have a major impact at county and district level, but parish councils are expected to continue in their current form.

After Bridget Culley's resignation there is a **vacancy on the Council**, and it is hoped that we will be able to co-opt a candidate at the next meeting on April 8th. The clerk has been approached by some individuals showing an interest.

The **Flood and Emergency Group** reported that work at Holdway Cottages is complete and the traffic lights and pumps at the Bourne Valley Inn are in the process of being removed, leaving the scheduled work at Applegate to be carried out in May. Meanwhile plans are being drawn up to identify the areas of **roadside verges** that need to be reinstated after the pumping and sewer repairs over the past two years.

Southern Water will be holding a public meeting in the Village Centre on **Monday March 31**st **at 7.30pm** to talk to all interested residents about what has been done over the past year and gather information on outstanding problems. It is hoped that this will be well attended by parishioners from along the valley, Stoke and St Mary Bourne.

What to do this month in the garden

Sow greenhouse crops including tomatoes, cucumbers, aubergines, peppers and chillies. If you haven't had time to sow crops this spring, catch up by buying young plants instead - supermarkets, garden centres and the Hurstbourne Priors May Fair are all good sources.

Be vigilant as the temperature rises – look out for slugs and protect your new plants. Lift and divide congested clumps of perennials Tie in new shoots on clematis, roses and other climbers to ensure they grow in the right direction.

Deadhead bulbs – pick off old flowerheads and leave the foliage to die down naturally Sprinkle fertiliser around perennials, trees, shrubs & roses

Support tall growing perennials with sticks, canes or metal supports.

Don't forget to keep your competition seed potatoes safe from frosts. Water well to ensure the compost never dries out and once the shoots break through - roughly every 7-10 days - earth up potatoes to cover over the shoots.
